ABOUT JENNY JACK SUN FARM

Located in Pine Mountain, Georgia, Jenny and Chris Jackson grow a wide variety of fruits, vegetables, herbs and flowers. We also raise heritage hogs for pork. In order to protect the life of our soil and the health of our customers, we use no chemical fertilizers or pesticides to grow our produce. We farm to provide meaningful work for ourselves and to provide you with quality, naturally grown food.

The farm is Certified Naturally Grown. We are dedicated to protecting our family farmland by implementing sustainable farming practices only. We are entering our 10th season as full time farmers.

WHAT IS CSA?

CSA stands for Community Supported Agriculture.

This concept supporting a healthier lifestyle started in Japan around 1965 and has now found its way to North America. CSA structure supports a ***close farmer-consumer relationship, promotes the freshness and quality of food and combats the environmental impact, costs, and long distances food travels from field to plate.***

HOW DOES A CSA WORK?

Families or individuals commit to supporting the CSA by paying a membership fee for the designated growing season, thus becoming a shareholder in the CSA. The fee goes to the farm to support their operations and, in turn, each member receives a weekly harvest of fresh, local produce.

WHAT DOES IT COST AND HOW MUCH PRODUCE DOES A MEMBER RECEIVE?

Each week the small share will receive 4-6 different crops; full shares will get 7-9 crops.

The Spring/Summer season is 16 weeks starting in April and going through July. The total cost of a small share is \$300 and a full share is \$400 for this season. Both share sizes can receive 1 doz. eggs every other week for an additional \$50.

The Fall season starts at the beginning of September and goes through mid December. The cost of a small share is \$225; full shares are \$340 for the Fall season. Members sign up for the Fall season separately from the Spring/Summer season.

WHAT DOES A SHAREHOLDER RECEIVE EACH WEEK?

Shareholders receive fresh, Certified Naturally Grown produce grown at our farm in Pine Mountain. It will be seasonal, that is, what is growing at that time. Greens and roots will be available during the cooler months of spring and fall, while fruits such as blueberries and tomatoes are harvested during the summer months. Shareholders will also receive a harvest list via e-mail prior to the week's pick-up with recipes. Additionally, Chris writes a weekly e-newsletter regarding farm news and events, so members are connected to what is going on at their farm!

HOW DO I BECOME A SHAREHOLDER?

Complete the Shareholder Agreement on the next page and return with payment to **Jenny Jack Sun Farm**. Full payment is preferred prior to the season, however, memberships can be paid in 2 installments – ½ at sign up and the remaining ½ due by first delivery.

PICK-UP OPTIONS

On-Farm: Wednesdays 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (begins April 5th)

Lagrange: St. Mark's Episcopal, Greenwood St., Tuesday afternoons 4-6 (begins April 4th)

Columbus: Dinglewood Park (midtown), Thursday afternoons 4-6 (begins April 6th)

↓ Example of a Full Share in the Spring: Green Onions, Rainbow Chard, Spinach, 'Easter Egg' Radishes, Kale, Japanese Lettuce, and Arugula. The Small Share would have received 5 of these items. Lots of greens are part of the Spring and Fall Shares!



SHAREHOLDER AGREEMENT

Jenny-Jack Sun Farm CSA will provide members with farm fresh food each week for the season through a small (\$300) or full share (\$400). This year, eggs will NOT be included in the full shares. Instead, small or full share members can pay an additional \$50 to receive eggs from Turntime Farms in their share every other week.

Each shareholder understands that it is their responsibility to pick up the share at their chosen site. Shares not picked up will be donated to our local food bank (FOCUS) or other persons in need.
